





Milwee Middle PTSA is also commended for providing a forum during their March General PTA Meeting for providing an introduction on the Foster and Adoption.







Congratulations to Sabal Point Elementary PTA for their Earth Day Challenge campaign. As part of this campaign, they encouraged their community to be a "Green Gator." They provided adorable seeded paper to plant to each student. They also encouraged students to reuse, reduce and recycle and provided recycling, through their "Terracycle" recycling efforts. Special containers were provided at school to collect these specific items including the following for recycling: writing instruments, markers, glue sticks, toothbrush, paste, floss containers, plastic packaging, flexible snack pouches like GoGo Squeezes or similar.

The capped off the Earth Day celebration activities by inviting the community to help them extend their garden space to include eight, raised beds with drip irrigation. Sabal Point Elementary PTA was able to acquire a \$500 grant from the Seminole County Farm Bureau to help support his effort. The community responded by not only helping to donate needed supplies for this project, but by coming out on April 22nd to help construct the raised beds and install the irrigation system.
